Join us for a Beautiful Selichot (penitential prayers) Ritual - Saturday, Sept. 9, at 9 pm

One of the highlights of the weeks of introspection leading to Rosh Hashanah is the ritual of Selichot. Fairmount Temple traditions on Selichot have introduced themes of penitence and meditations for peace, along with the sensory stimulation of Havdalah blessings, and changing the covers of our Torah scrolls. **On Selichot, Saturday, Sept. 9, our clergy team and congregants will join our neighbors at The Temple-Tifereth Israel for a lovely dessert reception at 8:30 pm, and Selichot worship at 9 pm.** This year's Selichot ritual will be hosted at The Temple-Tifereth Israel (26000 Shaker Blvd., Beachwood) and also live-streamed at titi.org. Worship will be co-led by our Cantor Vladimir Lapin and Rabbis Elle Muhlbaum, Joshua Caruso and Robert Nosanchuk, together with Cantor Kathy Sebo and Rabbis Yael Dadoun and Roger Klein.

We are grateful to the TTTI leadership for keeping safe many of our Torah scrolls after the April fire. Cantor Lapin has since worked closely with *soferet* ("scribe") Rabbi Bec Richman (*pictured at right*) to inspect carefully each of our precious scrolls, which we are glad to report did not suffer any smoke or fire damage. We are also grateful to Rabbi Richman for cataloguing future-needed repairs to our scrolls due to wear and tear over our congregation's long history. At the Selichot service, several of our scrolls and others from TTTI will have their robes changed. We will then return our scrolls home to our Fairmount Temple building and to our High Holy Day venue at Severance Music Center.



May they each be a source of blessing and inspiration, held in our arms and in our ark as the Shofar is sounded and a wonderful New Year begins!

We are also appreciative of our Fairmount Temple staff who organized a shift in venue for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur to Severance Music Center. Executive Director Julianna Johnston Senturia assures me how your generosity and input shaped plans for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur at Severance Music Center and our joyful return to Beachwood for Sukkot and Simchat Torah!



Please join us in-person or by live-streaming High Holy Day worship. I know you'll be inspired by the sacred music being prepared by our Cantor Vladimir Lapin and an ensemble of fine musicians. Children attending will delight in music from song-leader Ricky Marcus, joining clergy at High Holy Day worship for children who are 0-5, and clergy-led services for school-aged children on each High Holy Day. Thank you to our ACTY (Anshe Chesed Temple Youth) teen youth group members who are taking on special roles in our High Holy Days including co-leading with clergy our Tashlich ritual at Edgewater Park on Rosh Hashanah.

Our rabbis are preparing sermons on compelling issues of the day and to deepen understanding of Jewish values. On Yom Kippur we'll remember our loved ones at the Yizkor Memorial service, and also invite worshipers to consider how to build a more peaceful, just and fair world here where we live and in the State of Israel, which this year marks the 50th anniversary of the 1973 Yom Kippur War. The Milton and Ruth Stern and James A. Samuels Social Action program on Yom Kippur will feature an outstanding speaker, Dr. Airica Steed. She is President and CEO of Metro-Health, and a nationwide expert on healthcare disparities in the U.S.

Our Rabbi Elle Muhlbaum recently assumed full-time responsibilities, and I'm excited to introduce more of you to the special dimension she adds to our team! In previous roles she already contributed to High Holy Day worship and educational activity, earning city-wide recognition along with two other temple members honored by *The Cleveland Jewish News* as outstanding Jewish leaders under 36 years old. *I hope the upcoming High Holy Days, Shabbat programs and future lifecycle events will help you connect with her, as she spearheads temple's work in engaging Jewish young adults, strengthening social justice activism through advocacy for abortion access, and leading dozens of our members to the State of Israel in December.*

Please note: the recent fire and smoke damage sustained in April made our move to Severance Music Center for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur necessary. Thank you in advance for bringing a spirit of optimism and cooperation with you so we can share a beautiful, sacred and safe gathering. MUSIC MEDITATION

Pianist Alexandre Marr, Fairmount Temple's Music Director, discovered his passion for piano when he was 10 years old. He holds a Master of Music in Piano Performance from Kent State University and now serves on the collaborative piano faculty at his alma mater's Hugh A. Glauser School of Music. He also holds a passion for musical theatre and has performed on stage in regional equity productions. He was named Fairmount Temple's Music Director earlier this summer.

Violinist Maude Cloutier, born in Montréal, redefines what it means to be a versatile young musician in the contemporary classical music scene. She upholds a steady performing career in northeast Ohio and across America, in addition to recently completing the coveted Artist Certificate program at the Cleveland Institute of Music as a full scholarship student. She has also served the Cleveland Institute of Music Orchestra as its concertmaster, and is part of Case Western Reserve University's Baroque Chamber Orchestra.

Cellist Brendon Phelps is forging a path as an engaging cellist and collaborator. Phelps coached chamber music as part of a one-year residency at Shenandoah Conservatory. He also taught and performed at the Interlochen Academy as a chamber music teaching fellow and maintains a fully online cello studio with students throughout the US and Canada. He earned his Bachelors and Masters in music from the University of Akron and the Cleveland Institute of Music, respectively.

Dr. Steed came to Cleveland from Chicago. She's a fourth generation nurse and has a personal connection to health disparities, losing several family members to cancer and misdiagnoses. This fuels her passion to heal the healthcare system.

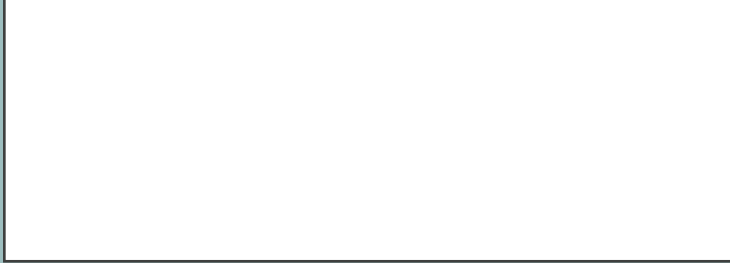
